Administrative/Biographical History

Grace Norcross Allen was born on May 15, 1868 in Brownsville, Pennsylvania, the first child of William Robert Norcross (1844-1908) and Mary Emma Barclay Norcross (1848-1939). Her three siblings were all born in Greeley, where her parents were among the pioneers of the Union Colony in 1870. In 1889, she married Ulysses M. Henderson. They had one son, John W. Henderson, who became a prominent local businessman and attorney. This marriage was dissolved in 1905, and the following year she married Albert J. Allen, who predeceased her in 1928. Having lived in Greeley her entire adult life, she died in her home there on March 20, 1948.

Grace Norcross graduated from Greeley High School in 1886, and began teaching school at Pleasant Valley at the age of 17. She continued teaching for a while at other schools, using the education she gained at the Colorado State College of Education in Greeley. Later, she served for a time as secretary of School District #6, and even ventured briefly into local politics, serving as deputy county treasurer. During the years between 1929 and 1939, she enjoyed traveling abroad, particularly in the company of three close Greeley friends, Mrs. Agnes Nusbaum, Mrs.

Kittie Marsh Parker, and Miss Elizabeth Kendel. With her active intellect and wide-ranging interests, her greatest passion was journalism.

Mrs. Allen wrote for the early "Denver Republican" as a Weld County correspondent, as well as for the "Weld County Republican." Long passionate about the history of the Union Colony and Greeley, she wrote extensively about the personalities and events that shaped its character and culture.

Scope and Content

This collection of the writings of Grace N. Allen is one component of a much larger collection associated with her name. It consists of approximately 75 typewritten manuscripts including 25 which were intended for oral presentation at meetings of the Want-to-Know Club. Two of the manuscripts were associated with photos which served as illustrations, and these photos are retained in the collection and linked to the corresponding manuscripts. There are also several pages of hand-written notes and personal correspondence which provided background information for articles.

In addition to the manuscripts, this collection also contains newspaper clippings of Mrs. Allen's series as they appeared in the Greeley Tribune in the 1930s and 40s. These series include: "Old Houses of Greeley", "Our Pioneer Neighbors", "Pioneer Days in Greeley", "Early School Days in Greeley", "Weld County Frontier Life", and "Cow County Recollections".
