### Administrative/Biographical History

#### **Biographical note on Archibald Lacy Camp III**

Archibald Lacy Camp III was born on March 14, 1876 to Archibald Lacy Camp Jr. and Carrie Camp in Covington, Georgia. Archibald's family moved to Greeley, Colorado when he was a young child. When he was older, he taught music including instruction for the mandolin. On October 12, 1902, Archibald married Marie Johanna Puttkammer, a former music student. Together the couple lived in Boulder, Colorado where he owned a music store. The couple had one son, Archibald Carl Camp, on June 21, 1908. Archibald was a renowned banjo player and also penned *Uncle Charley and His Rifle*. Archibald died on April 26, 1968 in Boulder.

#### **Biographical note on Archibald Carl Camp**

Archibald Carl Camp was born to Archibald Lacy Camp III and Marie Camp in 1908. In the 1930s he lived in Waikiki and was in Hawaii during Pearl Harbor. On December 20, 1941 he married Margaret Mortson in Hawaii. They had a short honeymoon on the island before having to leave due to potential food storage shortages. While in Hawaii, Carl worked as a mechanical

engineer, repairing and maintaining Hawaii's water pumping/sewage stations. Archibald Carl Camp died in 1984.
