Administrative/Biographical History

Florenz "Flo" Hinz was born on March 28, 1910 in Denver to parents Otto F. and Frances (Ordelheide) Hinz. He attended school in Denver and graduated from North High School. After living and working in Virginia and other areas throughout the East and Midwest, Florenz returned to Colorado, settling in Greeley in 1977.

He worked as a travel agent, and became very active in the cultural affairs of Greeley. He had experience in the entertainment industry, having worked as a promoter for MGM studios, Columbia, and Warner Brothers. He was one of the original advocates for the founding and construction of an auditorium and cultural center in Greeley, which came to be known as the Union Colony Civic Center. He worked tirelessly as a member of the Northern Colorado Foundation, which financially supported the civic center endeavor. He wrote letters to the paper, gave presentations to local clubs, and helped with fundraising and election efforts to make the plan for a civic center in Greeley a reality. After the UCCC was completed in 1988, Flo was a regular volunteer for various events.

In addition to volunteering at the UCCC, he also was an active volunteer for the City of Greeley Museums and was the first director of Centennial Village. A blue spruce tree was planted in his honor at Centennial Village. He passed away on January 13, 1996.

Scope and Content

This collection consists of archival materials saved by Florenz Hinz in relation to the Greeley Civic Theater, a local theatrical group, and the founding, fundraising, election, and construction of the Union Colony Civic Center.
