Administrative/Biographical History

Biographical note on August L. Rhiner

August L. Rhiner was born on May 25, 1897 in Denver, CO. He and his family came to Greeley in 1909. In 1920 he married Loa Meredith. After serving in World War One, he started working for United Air Lines in 1945 in Cheyenne and then was transferred to San Francisco and retired in 1962. He was a member of the First Congregational Church of San Mateo, Greeley Lodge No 809, BPOE, American Legion, and of the Last Squad. August died in San Mateo, California on September 7, 1977.

Biographical note on Ethelyne Rhiner

Ethelyne W. Rhiner was born on June 1, 1895 in Loveland, CO. She and her family came to Greeley in 1909. She attended Greeley High School and the Colorado State Teachers College, known today as the University of Northern Colorado, where she received both her Bachelors of Arts and Masters of Arts degrees. From 1918 to 1928 she taught at Meeker Junior High School, and from 1928-1960 worked at Greeley High School. She was a member of the First United

Methodist Church, Garden City Chapter No. 3, Order of the Eastern Star, Delta Kappa Gamma, Kappa Delta Pi, Alpha Sigma Alpha, and Grand Cross of Color of Rainbow for Girls. Ethelyne died on January 9, 1996.

Biographical note on Mary Jane Morris Rhiner

Mary Jane Morris Rhiner was born on April 14, 1872 in Wyandot, Kansas. She was a member of the First Methodist Church, Order of the Eastern Star, and the Social Order of Beauceant. Mary died on December 4, 1958.

Biographical note on Thomas Paine Rhiner

Thomas Paine Rhiner was born on May 6, 1872 in LaCrosse, Wisconsin. He and his family moved to Greeley in 1909 where he was in the plumbing trade and owned his own plumbing business. He was a member of the Masonic Lodge, Knights Templar, Woodimen of the World, and I.O.O.F. Thomas died on April 30, 1945.

Historical note on World War One

World War One, also known as the Great War, started on July 28, 1914. The war started as a European war but the United States joined the battle on April 6, 1917 after the publication of the Zimmerman Telegram. The United States passed the Selective Service Act in 1917 which drafted 2.8 million men to help the Allies fight in France. World War One ended on November 11, 1918.

Scope and Content

Collection of letters and envelopes that were written by August Rhiner or to August Rhiner by his sister Ethelyne or his parents during his service in World War One. There is also one photograph in the collection that was included in one of the letters. The letters start in Waco, Texas and end with him in France and Luxemburg.
