Administrative/Biographical History

Biographical note on August L. Rhiner

August L. Rhiner was born on May 25, 1897 in Denver, CO. He and his family came to Greeley in 1909. In 1920 he married Loa Meredith. After serving in World War One, he started working for United Air Lines in 1945 in Cheyenne and then was transferred to San Francisco and retired in 1962. He was a member of the First Congregational Church of San Mateo, BPOE Greeley Lodge No. 809, American Legion, and the Last Squad. August died in San Mateo, California on September 7, 1977.

Biographical note on Ethelyne Rhiner

Ethelyne W. Rhiner was born on June 1, 1895 in Loveland, CO. She and her family came to Greeley in 1909. She attended Greeley High School and the Colorado State Teachers College, known today as the University of Northern Colorado, where she received both her Bachelors of Arts and Masters of Arts degrees. From 1918 to 1928 she taught at Meeker Junior High School, and from 1928-1960 she worked at Greeley High School. She was a member of the First United

Methodist Church, Garden City Chapter No. 3, Order of the Eastern Star, Delta Kappa Gamma, Kappa Delta Pi, Alpha Sigma Alpha, and Grand Cross of Color of Rainbow for Girls. Ethelyne died on January 9, 1996.

Biographical note on Mary Jane Morris Rhiner

Mary Jane (Morris) Rhiner was born on April 14, 1872 in Wyandot, Kansas. She was a member of the First Methodist Church, Order of the Eastern Star, and the Social Order of Beauceant. Mary died on December 4, 1958.

Biographical note on Thomas Paine Rhiner

Thomas Paine Rhiner was born on May 6, 1872 in LaCrosse, Wisconsin. He and his family moved to Greeley in 1909 where he was in the plumbing trade and owned his own plumbing business. He was a member of the Masonic Lodge, Knights Templar, Woodmen of the World, and I.O.O.F. Thomas died on April 30, 1945.
