### **Administrative/Biographical History**

#### **Biographical note on Jacob Busch**

Jacob Busch was born November 23, 1875 in Dietel, Russia. On February 10, 1904, he married Mary Katherine Helterman in Oleschnaja, Russia. In 1907 the couple immigrated to the United States. Together the couple had 15 children, eight of whom survived to adulthood. During his time in Colorado, Jacob farmed in several communities including Windsor, Severance, Eaton, and Greeley. Jacob was a member of St. Paul's Congregational Church. Jacob died December 15, 1965 in Colorado.

#### **Biographical note on Samuel Busch**

Samuel J. Busch was born September 10, 1913 in Farmer's Spur, Colorado to Jacob and Mary Busch. Sam attended Eaton High School and graduated in 1931. On January 28, 1934, Sam married Sylvia Nadine Corbin in Eaton, Colorado. Together they had four children: Betty Sandra Busch Davis Hays (1935), Sylvia Benita Busch Callow (1936), Robert Busch (1940), and David Arthur Busch. Sam spent most of his life farming in the Eaton and Galeton areas but also served as president of the Weld County Farm Bureau and was the shop foreman of the Agricultural

Engineering Department at Colorado State University. Sam was a member of the First United Methodist Church. Sam died October 27, 1995 in Fort Collins, Colorado.

### **Biographical note on Solomon Busch**

Solomon Arthur Busch was born in August 1914 in Windsor, Colorado to Jacob and Mary Busch. Solomon attended Eaton High School and then Colorado State College of Education (CSCE). While attending CSCE he played football and was a member of the wrestling team. During his senior year, he was conscripted into the army where he served in the Pacific Theater during World War II. Solomon was killed in action in Luzon, Philippines on February 12, 1945. After his death he was awarded the Purple Heart which was presented to his parents.

### Biographical note on Martha Busch Gallupe

Martha Busch was born November 21, 1922 in Eaton, Colorado to Jacob and Mary Busch. Martha attended the University of Northern Colorado after high school. During World War II she was a member of the USNR WAVES in New Orleans. In 1946 she married Jack Robbins Gallupe. Together they had three children: Jack Robbins Gallupe Jr., David R. Gallupe, and Dawn Selene Gallupe Hunter. Martha was an elementary school teacher at the Widefield School District #3 and a kindergarten teacher at the Seventh Day Adventist Christian Academy in Colorado Springs.

### **Biographical note on Reuben Busch**

Reuben Busch was born November 11, 1919 in Pierce, Colorado to Jacob and Mary Busch. Reuben attended Eaton High School and was valedictorian of the class of 1938. He attended Colorado State College where he earned his degree in civil engineering. During World War II, he served with several units including the 1<sup>st</sup> Platoon, 189<sup>th</sup> Chemical Battalion. He was also stationed in several places and worked on several missions including Guadalcanal, Kokumboan, Tassa Fronga, Ruuuatav Mission Ghizuita Bannana. After serving, Reuben worked with the Water and Highway Departments in California as an engineer. Reuben died May 16, 1986 in Hood, California.

#### Biographical note on Benjamin Busch

Benjamin Arthur Busch was born March 30, 1925 in Eaton, Colorado to Jacob and Mary Busch. After high school he attended the University of Northern Colorado. During the summers, he attended several different international schools along with several other schools in the United States. Ben was a junior high and high school teacher in addition to being an accomplished pianist, organist, and linguist. During his time as a teacher, he taught at Fowler, Rocky Ford, Trieste, Munich, Paris, and New York. Ben died April 29, 1987 in Pueblo, Colorado.
