Administrative/Biographical History

Biographical note on William Kurtz

William Kurtz was born on May 14, 1890 in Denhoff, Russia. He came to the United States in 1910 and married Effie Frank in Windsor, Colorado on January 25, 1914. He worked for the Great Western Sugar Company and the city of Windsor before he retired. Kurtz was a devoted member of the Bethel American Lutheran Church throughout his life. Kurtz died December 14, 1970 from cancer. He was survived by his wife, his three daughters Effie Brunner, Ruth Rice, and Mary Ring, five grandchildren, one great-grandchild, and his brother, Philipp Kurtz of Greeley.

Biographical note on Eva “Effie” Elizabeth (Frank) Kurtz

Eva “Effie” Elizabeth Frank Kurtz was born in July 17, 1892 in Kautz, Russia. She came to the United States in 1909 and made her home in Windsor. She married William Kurtz in 1914. It is unclear if they came to the United States together or traveled separately. She was a member of the Bethel Lutheran Church. She had a brother, Philip Frank, who lived in Loveland, and two sisters, Elizabeth Lind and Mary Lind who lived in the Windsor and Greeley area. She had four children: Henry Kurtz, Mary Ring, Effie Brunner, and Ruth Rice. By her death on November 19, 1978, she had five grandchildren and three great-grandchildren.

Biographical note on Lt. Henry W. Kurtz

Henry Kurtz was born in 1921 in Windsor, Colorado. He lived in Windsor until he left for Army boot camp in 1943. After graduating Windsor High School in 1939, he was one of four to receive the Northern Colorado I.S.C. Scholarship. He attended Colorado A&M (now Colorado State University in Fort Collins) and was a part of the R.O.T.C. program there while studying chemistry. He married Annabelle Moorhead in 1943 and left for Army training in Kentucky that same year. He was deployed overseas in January of 1945. He was killed in action in April of 1945 in Germany. His body was cremated inside of the tank he was overseeing. There was no burial for him, but he is honored at the Henri-Chapelle American Cemetery and Memorial, which is located outside of Liege, Belgium. He had no children, but his widow, Annabelle, and his parents, William and Effie, were given his personal items after his death.

Biographical note on Mary Kurtz Ring

Mary Kurtz Ring was born on November 14, 1914 in Windsor, Colorado. She graduated from Windsor High School in 1933 and attended Colorado State Teacher's College (UNC) from 1933 to 1935 where she received her bachelorette in elementary education. She also earned a Life teaching certificate in 1941 and was a member of the Rural Education Club. She taught at rural schools in Northern Colorado from 1935 to 1948. Mary married Alex Ring on June 6, 1948. He worked for Farmer's Equipment. Mary and Alex had two children: Edmund Ring and Rosemary Ring Harroun. Mary Kurtz Ring died on September 10, 2002 in Torrington, Wyoming.

Biographical note on Alex Ring

Alex Ring was born on March 4, 1914 in Nebraska to Eva Elizabeth Batt and George Ring. He worked for Farmer's Equipment. He married Mary Kurtz on June 6, 1948. Alex and Mary had two children together, Edmund and Rosemary. Alex passed away on February 7, 2001.

Biographical note on Edmund Ring

Edmund Ring was born to Alex and Mary Ring. His education includes business classes at Aims Community College in Greeley, Colorado, Master of Arts and Bachelor of Arts in English from the University of Northern Colorado, and real estate classes. He worked as a tutor and proof reader at Aims and the University of Northern Colorado. He also worked as a realtor.

Biographical note on Jennings Lee Rice

Jennings Lee Rice was born in 1907. He went by Lee. His ancestors include John Paul Jones, a naval commander in the Revolutionary War, and Catesby ap Roger Jones, a confederate Navy commander during the Civil War. Lee married Ruth Kurtz on December 23, 1954. The couple did not have any children. The couple lived in Northern Colorado where Lee was the Executive Director of Housing Authority of Weld County. After his retirement, Lee and Ruth settled in Lottsburg, Virginia in a home built and owned by one of Lee's ancestors. He enjoyed golfing and restoring and landscaping his and Ruth's Virginia home. Lee passed away on December 9, 1982 in Kilmarnock, Virginia.

Biographical note on Ruth Amalia Kurtz Rice

Ruth Amalia Kurtz Rice was born on September 28, 1928. Her parents were William and Effie Kurtz. She grew up in Windsor and graduated from Windsor High School in 1946. She then attended Colorado State College (the University of Northern Colorado, UNC) and graduated in 1950. Ruth moved to Fort Lupton where she taught for 20 years after graduating from UNC. Ruth married Jennings "Lee" Rice on December 23, 1954. The couple did not have any children. Following Lee's retirement, the couple moved to Pennsylvania and later Virginia. The couple restored an 1806

colonial home built and owned by one of Lee's ancestors. Ruth wrote numerous books and pamphlets of educational materials for a variety of subjects for high school teachers. In addition, she contributed articles to educational journals and other publications. She volunteered for the Weld County Food Bank and Greeley History Museum. Ruth was a big proponent for the Lifeline system, and her and her sister, Effie, donated the Lifeline to NCMC. Ruth passed away in Greeley on March 9, 2012.

Biographical note on Eva Elizabeth "Effie" Kurtz Brunner

Effie Brunner was born on January 16, 1917 in Windsor, Colorado to William and Effie Elizabeth Kurtz. Effie was educated in Windsor and graduated from Windsor High School in 1934. Effie then went to Colorado State College of Education (now the University of Northern Colorado) where she received a bachelor's degree in elementary education in 1939. Effie lived in Greeley, Colorado from 1934 to 1939. On November 11, 1946 Effie married Henry H. Brunner (d. November 1979) in Greeley, Colorado. Effie and Henry had three children, two sons, Neill and Kenton, and one daughter, Marjean. Effie was a member of the Bethel Lutheran Church in Windsor. Effie served on the Windsor Republican Women's Committee and on the Library board (where she was instrumental in raising funds for the community's new library in the 1960s). She served on several other church committees, lectured at Windsor Schools, served on the Home Health Care Advisory Board at the North Colorado Medical Center (NCMC). Effie was named the Volunteer of the Year in 1984 for Weld County. In addition, Effie and her sister, Ruth Rice, donated the Lifeline to NCMC. Effie lived in Windsor, Colorado for the majority of her life. In her last year,s she lived in Fort Collins at her daughter's home before living her last year at the home of Ron and Venita Christian. Effie passed away at the Christian's home on Friday, May 12, 2000.
