Administrative/Biographical History

Hazel Johnson (1902 – 2002) was born in Leon, Kansas, one of seven children. She attended business school in Colorado Springs, Colorado, worked in business and banking for several years in Southeastern Colorado, then chose to move to Greeley in 1938 to work for the Department of Revenue. She happily embraced Greeley as her adopted hometown, and devoted herself to preserving and teaching its history for the rest of her life.

Miss Johnson promoted the knowledge of local history by writing articles for the Denver Post and the Christian Science Monitor, and wrote a regular column in the Greeley Journal for 20 years. Later, she wrote a monthly column for the “Senior Voice” magazine in Weld County. She preserved local history in physical form by soliciting and collecting artifacts and photographs from local residents that she later donated, along with her writings and other books, to the City of Greeley Museums and the University of Northern Colorado. In addition to her collections and her writing, Miss Johnson also devoted countless hours to the preparation and presentation of historical programs on select topics to local service organizations, church groups, and clubs. This donation features the manuscripts for dozens of these historical programs.

Scope and Content

This donation is the last of several made by Hazel E. Johnson, and comprises the remaining items in her estate that she wished to bequeath to the City of Greeley Museums. The greater part of this collection consists of the scripts and manuscripts for the historical programs she presented

to community groups from the 1960s until the end of the century. In addition to the finished manuscripts, there are several hundred clippings she identified variously as jokes, poems, or “philosophical tidbits” which she incorporated into her talks. Other items in this donation are letters, certificates, photographs and business records. The business records reflect her acquisition of artifacts which would tell the story of Weld County’s past. In the letters, photographs and other documents, we see evidence of her role as a benefactor of the UNC history department and the UNC Foundation, as well as her invaluable contribution to the City of Greeley Museums.
